





In this, the centennial year of the Armistice ending World War I, the Friends of Webb-Blessing House & the Jefferson County Black History Preservation Society (JCBHPS) presented an all-day conference on Friday, June 30, 2018, recognizing the contributions of African Americans to the Allies' fight for freedom. Co-sponsors were the Jefferson County Historical Society, the Jefferson County Museum, the *Spirit of Jefferson County* newspaper, and the Shepherdstown Bag and Author Group. Emphasis is on the impact of Jefferson County African-American WWI soldiers on their community over the last 100 years. The conference honors the life and legacy of James Alvin Tolbert, one of the founders of JCBHPS and a civil rights leader. Items from the Edward Dabney Tolbert Collection at the Jefferson County Museum, donated by the Tolbert family, were on display at the conference. MWPGM George Rutherford #1 and PM James L. Taylor, co-founders of the JCBHPS, and Susannah Buckles, daughter of Frank Buckles, the nation's longest living WWI veteran, who died in 2011 at the age of 110. They will discuss the influence Jefferson County's WWI soldiers had on the Jefferson County community, based on their personal experiences growing up in the county. 





The following remarks were taken from an article in the Logan Banner Newspaper: This is Jones first head coaching job. He has been a CRHS assistant the last six years.

Jones is a 1990 graduate of Logan High School and played football for the Wildcats under Wayne Bennett in the late 1980s. He played on both the offensive and defensive lines and previously attended the old Logan East Junior High School.

Jones is also a kidney transplant survivor.

"This particular senior class was with me when I was still on dialysis and when I got my transplant," he said. "I had a kidney transplant and for awhile I was on kidney dialysis. It was tough for me and to sustain a full time job. Now, I do a lot of guest speaking appearances and speak for the Center for Organ Recovery and National Donate Life."Jones says he has fully recovered from the surgery.

"I got my transplant back in 2014," he said. "It was really a life changing experience because I had been on dialysis for about four years, even when I first started coaching here at the middle school I was still on dialysis. I was at practice one day in 2014 and my phone rang and it was the transplant office. I left practice and got a transplant, healed up and I'm back. September 10 was my three-year anniversary. Medically, it's been a success."

Jones' son R.J. is a CMS player and a staple on the sidelines during Chapmanville varsity games where he volunteers as the ball boy.

"He's a field rat," Jones said of his son. "I've been here six years and so has he. He's been running around here a long time. They all know him since he's been young. It's amazing because he will sit around and hear the plays and sits around on chalk talk and he might walk down and say, 'Daddy, you know such and such needs to do this.' Sometimes he'll give me a few suggestions. It's awesome having him around. He loves it just like I do. Chapmanville made five straight playoff appearances from 2007-11.



From this year's A Special Place West Virginia: Calvin Woods of Dunbar was diagnosed with kidney disease nearly 20 years ago. Last year, his kidney function required dialysis. He didn't know if he would be well enough to receive

a kidney transplant or continue working to support his family. In March, he received the call that changed everything — a match had been found.

Good Morning,

My name is Calvin Woods and my life was saved by the generosity of an organ donor, when I received a kidney transplant.

That's why I'm here today. I want to honor not just my donor, but also your loved one. I want to say thanks to you and your loved one for being a hero and lifesaver.

If it wasn't for your love one, people like me would have no hope.

I have a family history of renal failure. I lost my father and a sister to this dreaded disease. I myself was diagnosed with kidney failure in early 2000.

In 2017, my kidney function was down to 14% and it was recommended that I start preparing for treatment by dialysis. But after three unsuccessful operations to place the fistula that would make dialysis possible, doctors told me that I was out of options. A kidney transplant was the only way to save my life. My energy level was low and had constant back pain. I didn't know if a kidney would become available in time; I honestly thought my blood type lengthen the wait time. I worried that I would no longer be able to work and support my family.

But in March, I received a call that would change my life. It was a from a nurse from the renal transplant team—they had a kidney for me and I needed to get to the hospital as soon as possible. I was in a state of shock. I had so many thoughts running through my mind. The call had come so quickly that I hadn't even had my introductory first appointment with the transplant surgeon and the renal team. I had no idea what to expect. I just knew that this was my second chance at life.

After getting myself together, I called my wife to let her know. I then returned to work and told my supervisor that I was receiving the kidney I need to save my life and heading to the hospital.

The transplant went smoothly thanks to Dr. Africa and his staff and the nurses at CAMC General. That was only six months ago and I'm already back at work. I don't worry about how I'm going to support my family anymore. I don't suffer with debilitating pain. It's September and I've returned to work.

Organ Donation saved my LIFE.

During a time of sorrow and grief, you and your family decided to make a difference in someone's life. Your compassion gave a person like me, a perfect stranger, a second chance.

My Family and I say "THANK YOU". You are my heroes.
